6. The students should explain how women have been portrayed negatively in two novels read:

Examples: from the novel *A MAN OF THE PEOPLE* by Chinua Achebe woman is seen as follows:

(i) Woman is portrayed as a person who is prostitute and immoral. Example Elsie who has sex relationship with several men like Ralph, Odili and Chief Nanga.

(ii) Woman is seen as a person who does not have a freedom on making decision or even on the matter of Marriage. Example Echina Odo is forced to get marriage to Chief Nanga because he is a rich person and because he financed her education.

(iii) Woman is seen as a person sex object example Elsie is used for sex purpose only even Odili proved it when he says, "Elsie mentioned Ralph at the heat of thing. Also Chief Nanga uses women for sex purpose as he sleeps with Elsie and Mrs Akilo while he has his own wife. Herzekiah Samalu has five women.

(iv) Woman is seen as a person who is easily cheated and not respected. ~~Exam~~ as well as easy to be betrayed. Example Mrs Nanga is cheated and betrayed by her husband who has sex relationship with other women out of wedlock.

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7. Introduction:

The student should define the basic terms in the question as well as introducing the novels to be used. [02 marks]

The student should explain the challenges and solutions toward the revealed challenges.

Examples from The novel A MAN OF THE PEOPLE by Chinua Achebe: The writer reveals the problems as follows:

(i) The problem of corruption done by the government leaders like Chief Nanga who uses government fund to enrich himself. As he buys (10) luxury buses. This problem should be solved by all people to reveal this evil. To provide education on the effect of corruption to national development and to introduce strict rules against corrupt people.

(ii) The problem of womanization shown by Chief Nanga who has sex relationships with several women like Elsie, Mrs Akilo, Jean and he wants to marry Edna while he is having his lovely wife. The problem of womanization should be solved by all men to be faithful in their marriage.

(iii) The problem of polygamy revealed by Hezekiah Samalu who has five wives hence makes him to be irresponsible to his family. This problem should be solved by encouraging men to have one wife in order to be responsible to their family.

(iv) The problem of poverty shown by Edna's family who are living in poor life condition. Living in a thatched house. They do not have money to pay medicine for their mother who is admitted at hospital.

7. The problem of poverty should be solved by encouraging people to work hard, as well as encouraging leaders to provide better services to their people.

In the novel THE BEAUTIFUL ONES ARE NOT YET BORN by Axi Kwei Armah. The author reveals the following problems which are supposed to be solved as follows:-

(i) The problem of corruption shown by Amankwaa Abednego and Zacharia which is the source of underdevelopment in Ghana. This problem should be solved by arresting and punishing them. All people who are corrupt.

(ii) The problem of humiliation which has been revealed by the government leaders who are represented by the bus driver and the bus conductor as they humiliate majority represented as passengers. Humiliation can be solved by educating people on its effect as it is against human right.

(iii) The problem of prostitution where by most of girls in Ghana are prostitute. Example prostitutes who live at ESSEI MARKETS. A prostitute who tells the man "give" when the man hussed at her. Most of them engage in prostitution because of poverty. This problem should be solved by encouraging them to work hard in other economic activities and educating on the effect of prostitution in their life.

(iv) The problem of conflict revealed by the man and his wife Ofo should be solved by encouraging people to love each other in marriage and cooperating
